#### **PBIS News**

Did you know that WFES is a Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) School? **What is PBIS?** 

- PBIS is a research-based approach that focuses on creating positive environments that are more conducive to learning.
- PBIS uses proactive strategies to support pro-social behaviors.
- PBIS provides a continuum of supports, including rewards and consequences, in all environments.
- PBIS provides consistent routines, language and expectations.

#### **West Friendship Expectations**

West Friendship has 3 school-wide behavior expectations that are reinforced daily. These rules can be applied to situations both inside and outside of school.

- 1. Be Respectful
- 2. Be Responsible

### 3. Be Ready to Learn

One of our PBIS goals is that positive behaviors are rewarded consistently. In the virtual setting, we do this at WFES via:

- Weekly Virtual Tiger Certificates: Teachers select a student from their class who goes above and beyond to show the 3 R's. These students are rewarded with their name highlighted in the Friday Morning Announcements as well as being sent a Certificate through their Canvas Inbox.
- Class Cards: \*New for Quarter 2\* Each class has the opportunity to earn a class reward of their choosing if they get the 10 blank spaces on their Class Card filled up. A paw is earned on the card for excelling with the WFES expectations. Classes can earn paws not only from their homeroom teacher, but from a Related Arts class as well. Once the class has filled up their Class Card, a class reward is earned.

## **Technology**

## What happens if I/my child has a connectivity or other issue logging on to class?

We recognize there may be times the applications HCPSS is using for virtual learning may not work as anticipated. This may be due to the nationwide increase in demand on these services or an issue with your local internet provider. HCPSS teachers will be understanding and flexible if interruptions to technology services cause delays in assignment submissions and missed virtual learning sessions.

Additionally, if there is a power outage or other situation out of the student's control that would prevent them from completing an assignment, the student or parent/guardian should contact the teacher as soon as possible to alert them to the issue and determine if the due date can be extended. ## **Technology Security**

As we continue to rely on technology, it is critical that each of us does our part to ensure that technology is used safely. Threats to our online safety and the health of our technology are present

every time we click a link, open an email or visit a website. HCPSS has provided <u>helpful guidelines</u> on our website that you are encouraged to review, follow and share.

### **TO DO - HCPSS Google Play Store-- Parents must OPT IN for students to access!**

Did you know that HCPSS has curated a new set of supplemental digital tools that are available for students to use? Parents must complete a very quick (less than 1 minute) process in order for their child to access these resources like various coding apps, digital books and other reading materials, and more. Please OPT IN to the HCPSS Google Play store as soon as possible.

These supplemental digital tools are approved by HCPSS and comply with federal, state and Howard County Board of Education student data privacy policies. Due to Google's settings, students must access this set of tools by utilizing Google's menu of additional services, which requires consent by a parent or guardian.

To provide consent:

- 1. Log in to HCPSS Connect.
- 2. Select More Options from the left panel.
- 3. Select HCPSS Google Menu from the middle of the page.
- 4. Click the check box to provide consent. Changes are saved automatically.

A parent or guardian must provide consent for each student by selecting the student's name at the top of the page.

#### Please note:

- HCPSS cannot guarantee that apps are available on devices other than HCPSS Chromebooks.
- Teachers may or may not choose to use any or all of these apps during instruction. Students will be notified when a particular app will be used for instruction.
- If you do not provide consent for your student's access to these digital tools, your student's teacher will provide alternative enrichment activities.
- In addition to these Google tools, HCPSS has approved a robust set of <u>supplemental digital</u> <u>tools</u>. Your child's teacher will notify you of the particular supplemental digital tools being used in each class via email or on their Canvas course page.
