Spring 2021 MAP Testing

Students in grades 1-5 will take the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment in May. Please see below for the remaining testing dates for each grade. For questions about MAP testing, please contact Mr. Vanisko at <u>brian_vanisko@hcpss.org</u>

Tuesday, May 18 - Grade 1 (Group A & Virtual students) MAP Reading (1:55-3:50 PM) Wednesday, May 19 - Grades 2-5 MAP Reading (9:45-11:45 AM) Thursday, May 20 - Grade 1 (Group B) MAP Reading (1:55-3:50 PM)

We encourage all students to take the computer adaptive assessment. It is computer-adaptive because it adjusts to your child's level based on the correct and incorrect responses provided by your child. **This is why we ask that you** <u>do not</u> help your child with the content of the assessment. Having the most accurate data from this assessment will help teachers individualize instruction this year and next year.

The MAP test does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. It is normal for students to only answer about half the questions correctly. If your child is unable to attend, makeup testing will be offered.

Kindergarten Registration Continues

Online Registration for students entering Kindergarten in fall continues. Please share this information with your friends and neighbors. There will be no in-person registration appointments at this time.

Kindergarten is mandatory in Maryland, so if your child turns 5-years old by September 1, 2021, you must register your child for the 2021-22 school year. Parents or guardians are to register students at the school serving the address where the child's parent or guardian resides. Step 2: Complete registration online by providing the documents listed below. *The registration process is easier if you upload them during online registration. Otherwise, you will be asked to submit them via email as pdfs. I-phone users can scan documents through your notes app. (Images must be clear.)*

The following documents are needed for registration:

• Child's evidence of birth (i.e.: birth certificate, baptismal certificate)

- An authorized record of immunizations
- Proof of residency in the form of a signed lease or deed including signature pages
- Current utility bill
- Photo ID of parent/guardian
- Proof of custody (if applicable)

Mobile Testing Sites

Howard County is dedicated to expanding COVID-19 testing to residents in our community who many not have adequate access. First Call Urgent Care and Centennial Medical Group are implementing four mobile testing units in the following locations:

- Long Reach Village Center (Monday, 3pm-7pm)
- North Laurel Community Center (Tuesday, 3pm-7pm)
- Normandy Shopping Center (Wednesday, 3pm-7pm)

- Recreation and Parks Headquarters (Thursday, 3pm-7pm)
- The Elkridge 50+ Center (Friday, 3pm-7pm)

Rapid testing and PCR testing will be available to residents at no cost. These new testing sites will help us promote more equitable healthcare and ensuring our most vulnerable populations have access to COVID-19 testing.
