## **2022 Academic Calendar Modifications**

In order to provide school-based staff with additional time to address their increased workload and to support employee well-being, the Board of Education approved updates to the current <u>academic year calendar</u>. Three-hour early dismissals now will take place on the following dates:

#### **Outdoor Dining and Outdoor Recess**

When we are able, we continue to offer outdoor dining. We also have outdoor recess whenever we can. Please have your children dress for the weather, so they are prepared for outdoors. The following factors are considered in determining if dining and/or recess is to be held outside:

- Temperature and humidity
- Wind chill
- Heat index and air quality
- Age of students
- Length of time outdoors
- Adequacy of the children's clothing
- Condition of the playground
- Falling precipitation (more than a sprinkle or mist)
- Thunder and lightning

Generally, it is assumed that students will be outside for recess when the temperature combined with the wind chill is not less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit or the heat index reading is less than 95. Children with certain health conditions may need special accommodations during extremely hot or cold weather. Parents of those children should provide medical documentation and may be consulted to determine if other arrangements are necessary.
