# **Update on Instructional Supports, During Quarantine**

Beginning the week of September 27, the HCPSS Evening School program will offer virtual grade-level academic support sessions for eligible elementary and middle school students who must quarantine or who are struggling academically. These sessions will be available on Google Meet each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 6-8 p.m., and consist of parallel small group sessions in elementary English and math; and middle school English, math, science and social studies. Parents are encouraged to attend with their child.

Schools will contact the families of students designated as eligible to participate. Parents also may request that their child participate by contacting the school principal.

These sessions build on the existing cadre of supports for quarantining students, which include grade-level materials packets for elementary students, assignments and instructional materials posted on teachers' Canvas pages for all levels, and the availability of weekly virtual check-in sessions. #### **Attention Parents!**

As we head into Week 4 of the 21-22 school year, we would like to remind parents to please do your best to limit doctor appointments and early dismissals during the school week. It is important for your student(s) to maintain a routine each day, which includes being present for the entire school day. We would also like to remind parents to help your child(ren) get into the habit of making sure they have their lunch, water bottle, Chromebook with charger, and musical instrument (if they play one) on a daily basis. We are trying to limit the amount of drop-offs during the school day. Thank you for partnering with us to establish consistent attendance habits and school preparedness early in the school year.

# **Mask Policy**

We continue to remind our students, regularly, about wearing their masks properly. We are reminding them that their mask should cover their nose and mouth. In addition, students must where their mask on the school bus. Please check to be sure your child has a mask each day before leaving home. It is a good idea to place an extra mask in their backpack. We just want to keep everyone safe.

# Daily COVID-19 Self-Screenings

All parents/guardians are to perform a <u>COVID-19 health check</u> every day before your student leaves home. Students are not to come to school if they are experiencing any <u>symptom(s)</u> <u>associated with COVID-19 or other communicable disease</u>.

#### **Absence Email Reminder**

- Excuses for absences from school are required by Maryland law. Please do not send your child's absent note through Canvas. All absent notes must be emailed to <a href="https://www.wfesabsence@hcpss.org">wfesabsence@hcpss.org</a> and include student name, date of the absence, and the reason for the absence. You may attach any documentation from medical professionals, if needed. If this information is not included, the note will not be accepted. This email goes directly to our Attendance Secretary. Thank you in advance for adhering to our absence reporting procedures. This email is used to report absences only.
- Please do not send changes to transportation to this email address, as we will not see the changes. Any
  time there is a change in transportation, and any time your child has an after school activity, you must
  send a hard copy note to school with your child. Do <u>not</u> send an email, as it may not be seen if there is a
  substitute in your child's classroom.

## **Dismissal Arrangements**

- All students will be sent home their usual way unless they have a hard copy note with alternate
  arrangements, signed by their parent/guardian. Please do not expect a child to relay this important
  information. This often causes confusion. Do <u>not</u> send an email, as it may not be seen if there is a
  substitute in your child's classroom.
- Students will not be permitted to ride any bus other than the bus which they are assigned. Students have assigned seats on the bus, and seating is limited.

# **Text Message Access**

HCPSS and WFES often communicate important information that we need parents to know immediately via text messages. If you receive our texts, then you do not need to do anything else! If you do not, we highly recommend that you opt-in. Here are the instructions on how to opt-in to text messaging...

- Text the word "YES" to 67587 from the wireless device you wish to receive texts on.
- You will receive an "opt in" message from HCPSS sent from SchoolMessenger.
- Text Y and hit send.
- You will now begin receiving text alerts from WFES and HCPSS.

- Please have a close relative, family friend, and daycare provider sign up for HCPSSNews alerts. This is a helpful safeguard on unexpected early dismissal days. Community members or any non-HCPSS can sign up to receive messages by visiting this sign-up page.

#### **Student/Parent Handbook**

The 2021-2022 <u>Student and Parent Handbook</u> is now available on the HCPSS website. This resource is helpful for navigating the school year and includes information about HCPSS practices, policies and services available to support and enrich learning. A printed version of the handbook is no longer provided.

#### **Procedures for Visitors and Volunteers**

We are excited that we can once again allow visitors and volunteers into the building. Teachers are planning their volunteer needs and will reach out to you in the coming weeks. Parents are asked to please read and complete the following procedures now, so you can be ready when volunteer opportunities become available.

- Parents & visitors entering the school for a brief visit to pick up or drop off their child, or for other reasons, are not required to show proof of vaccination or testing. They are, however, required to be masked regardless of their vaccination status.
- Parents are not permitted to eat lunch in the school cafeteria with students at this time.
- Parents who are <u>conducting classroom visits or observations</u> must provide proof of vaccination status or a
  negative COVID-19 test (within seven days of the current date) to school administration when they check
  in at the front office.
- Visitors should <u>perform a COVID-19 health check</u> every day before coming to an HCPSS building and should stay home if they are experiencing any symptom(s) associated with any communicable disease.
- Please be prepared, sometime after October 4 all volunteers entering HCPSS schools to interact with or support students must provide proof of vaccination status or a negative COVID-19 test (within 7 days of the current date) to school administration when they check in at the front office.
- Volunteers must be masked regardless of their vaccination status. Volunteers may be able to access the
  free weekly testing offered within school and office buildings, subject to availability of tests. Volunteers
  should <u>perform a COVID-19 health check</u> every day before coming to an HCPSS building and should stay
  home if they are experiencing any symptom(s) associated with any communicable disease.
- Additionally, all <u>volunteers must complete a Confidentiality Training Course</u> about protecting the privacy of our students, staff, and schools, and the <u>Child Abuse and Neglect Training</u> about reporting any suspicion of child abuse or neglect to Howard County Department of Social Services.
