Students in fifth grade during the 2018-2019 school year who were not involved in the band program during fourth grade, may also join as a fifth grade beginner. If your child was in band in fourth grade, you should also register your child for band for fifth grade. Girls on the Run

Attention Parents of Rising 3rd, 4th & 5th Grade Girls:

I am trying to gauge interest in restarting a Girls on the Run (GOTR) program at West Friendship. It has been a few years since we've had one. I think it would be great, but I need to make sure that there is enough interest and volunteer support to make it happen.

- Volunteer Coaches: Each team must have 3-4 coaches. All coaches must attend a GOTR training session.--Ideally, I'd like to have 4 coaches so that each coach only has to attend one session per week.
- Team Size: We must have a minimum of eight girls and a maximum of 20 for GOTR
- Practice Schedule: Practices would be 2 weekdays per week, directly after school
- Fees and Financial Aid: \$150 per 10-week season. Partial needs-based scholarships are available based on the Free and Reduced Meals Program (FARMs)
- Dates: Fall Season--which usually begins the 3rd week of September

If we don't have enough interest to do the Fall, we could do the Spring instead. Let me know if you have a strong preference between the two seasons. The 10 week Spring season usually begins the 3rd week of March

General Overview: Over a period of 10 weeks, girls in the 3rd through 5th grade participate in an after-school program like no other. Designed to allow every girl to recognize her inner strength, the Girls on the Run curriculum inspires girls to define their lives on their own terms. Throughout the season, the girls make new friends, build their confidence and celebrate all that makes them unique.

The Girls on the Run lessons encourage positive emotional, social, mental and physical development. Participants explore and discuss their own beliefs around experiences and challenges girls face at this age. They also develop important strategies and skills to help them navigate life experiences. We start with helping the girls get a better understanding of who they are and what's important to them. Then, we look at the importance of team work and healthy relationships. And, finally, the girls explore how they can positively connect with and shape the world.

Physical activity is woven into our program to inspire an appreciation of fitness and to build habits that lead to a lifetime of health. At the end of each three month session, the girls participate in a Girls on the Run 5K event. This celebratory, non-competitive event is the culminating experience of the curriculum.

Please let me know if you'd be able to commit to coaching and/or if your daughter would be interested in participating. I will send additional information to those who respond once I determine if having GOTR is feasible.
